<b>Other Pathways to Apprenticeship</b>				
1. Networking	If you have an employer willing to sign you for an apprenticeship, we may be able save you a registration fee and help your employer access funding to help reduce the cost of training. <b>See your Guidance counsellor or Co-op teacher and ask for a pre-registration form.</b>			
2. College Diploma Program	Seneca, Sheridan, Mohawk, all offer 2 year Diploma programs. See <a href="http://www.ontariocolleges.ca/pdf/college_guide.pdf">http://www.ontariocolleges.ca/pdf/college_guide.pdf</a> for full details.			
3. University Degree Program	York and Ryerson both offer BA programs in Early Childhood Education. Ryerson and George Brown also offer a combined diploma degree programs (see your Guidance counsellor for more details.			
4. Apprenticeship	Seneca College and Mohawk both offer apprenticeship courses leading to possible Certification as an Early Childhood Educator.			
5. ECE <b>Concentrated OYAP</b>	Requires Grade 12 College or University English. Concentrated OYAP students earn 4 Secondary school Co-op credits and 3 Seneca College ECE Seneca College credits in the same semester. OYAP allows students to explore Early Childhood Education both in the work place and at the college, earning both secondary school credits and Seneca College credits at the same time. If your employer agrees you can pursue your ECE Certification through the Apprenticeship.
