However C-op is also a part of the Concentrated OYAP program offered in Grade 11, 12 or 12+, or a 4 Credit OYAP Co-op could be an alternative to Concentrated OYAP.</p> <p>Sault, St. Lawrence and St Clair Colleges offer 1 year pre-apprenticeship programs check (check http://www.ontariocolleges.ca/pdf/college_guide.pdf). Cost approximately \$ 3000</p> <p>Oakville College offers a pre-apprenticeship Certificate program. Check (www.oakvillecolleges.com) for full details. Cost approximately \$ 6000</p> <p>Concentrated OYAP is similar to the one-year certificate program at the colleges above. Concentrated OYAP prepares you for academic success in the apprenticeship courses offered at College, in addition students may earn an exemption from both levels of Apprenticeship Training at College. Concentrated OYAP teachers will also assist you in finding a co-op placement that has the potential to become an apprenticeship.</p> <p>Students planning to pursue University or college in addition to apprenticeship must check entrance requirements for each university or college program individually.
